FWOTC OPEN MEETING FEBRUARY 21,2024

Old Business -

Letter of intent has been passed out for the club members to read through - January 21, 2024. As a board we propose moving the July and September 2024 agility trials to Adventuretails. We will revisit the contract with Adventuretails following the 2024 trials. The May and October agility trials will be kept at the Plex. The cost of pulling out of the Plex for the four contracted trials 2024 and 2025 is \$9,740. The Plex contract can be revisited in 2025. We did move the dates out per AKC because it could have been an issue trying to change the location after a premium has been published.

Steve passed out and also read the contract with the Plex to the members of the club. He impressed upon the members to read the cancelation policy.

We opened the meeting to discussion. Several people voiced opinions and asked questions. Kelly Kohlmeyer spoke with a contract lawyer and says it would be small claims court in order to get out of it.

Julia Beerman made a motion we have all 4 trials at Adventuretails. May July September and October in 2024 and 2025. Leslie White second. Kelly, Tamra, Kathy D and Bonita counted the votes. There are only 8 no's so the motion passed.

Carol Michaels made a motion to get a lawyer to get out of the plex contract. Tamra feels we should call the plex first and explain we would like to be on a good relationship with them and hopefully get out of the contract. Steve will be asked to send a follow up letter stating what was discussed. Motion amended three people representing the club to discuss the contract with them and then follow up with a letter. If not agreed upon then consult a lawyers. Motion carried.

Julia moved Jane bowman and Chuck Edwards be trial chairs. Point of Order was called by Kelly Urick due to lack of information. We will readdress this after the May trial.

Cindi Lee addresses Farm Dog 2 concurrent. A one day trial Kelly Urick will be trial secretary. Oct 12 or 13 or 26 or 27. A decision was made to have the trial October 26, 2024 at Cindi Lees farm.

We will donate this session to Defiance and Dekalb counties.



STEPS TO SIGN-UP FOR A CLASS

- 1. Find the appropriate class(es) for you to take. If you have any questions about which class that is, you can check with your teacher or the appropriate DOT. We welcome questions, so please don't hesitate.
- 2. On Sign-Up day, no sooner than 11am, send your information including the handler's full name, email address, phone number, dog's name, breed, age and method of payment along with the class(es) requested to the appropriate sign-up person. They are:

Agility: Kathy Dullaghan, fwotc.agility@gmail.com

Sign-Up starts the Sunday before the Open Meeting at 11am. The Sign-up period continues until the following Sunday. Some classes can fill quickly so the closer to 11am you send your request on the first day, the better. Sending it at 11am is the best.

- 3. You should receive a confirmation within 3 days.
- 4. Have fun with your dog!!

CANINE GOOD CITIZEN EXERCISES

- 1. Accepting a friendly stranger. Evaluator approaches, shakes hands with handler. Does not touch dog.
- 2. Sitting politely for petting. Evaluator pets dog, dog must show no shyness or resentment.
- 3. Appearance and grooming. Exaluator inspects dog, combs or brushes lightly, examines ears and each front foot.
- 4. Out for a walk. Handler takes dog for a short walk including right turn, left turn, about turn, and stop.
- 5. Walking through a crowd. Dog and handler walk close to several people; dog may show casual interest but not jump up.
- 6. Sit and down on command/Staying in place. Handler shows dog can do sit and down, then chooses a position, leaves dog and goes to the end of a 20 ft. line and returns immediately.
- 7. Coming when called. With dog still on 20 ft. line from Test 6, handler walks out 10 ft. and calls the dog.
- 8. Reaction to another dog. Two handlers and dogs approach, shake hands, exchange pleasantries, move on. Dogs can show casual interest.
- 9. Reaction to distraction. Distractions are presented; dog may not panic or show aggression.
- 10. Supervised Separation. Handler goes out of sight for 3-min. Dog is held on 6 ft. leash by an evaluator.



MEMBER OBEDIENCE CLASSES TUESDAY MORNING! APRIL 23RD – JUNE 6TH, 2024

9:00AM - 10:00AM ALL THINGS NOVICE INSTRUCTORS: LESLIE WHITE/ BILL OTTER

This class will cover all exercises for UKC and AKC pre-novice through novice exercises. There will be two levels of dogs working in this class. Handler and dog will learn to perform exercises according to their level. Two rings and two instructors will be used for this class so everyone will have adequate practice time. Prerequisite: Obedience Fundamentals

11:00AM - 12:00PM OBEDIENCE FUNDAMENTALS

INSTRUCTOR: JULIA BEERMAN

FREE TO NEW MEMBERS: Basic sit, stay, recall and heel exercises will be taught. The dog must be able to pass the proficiency skills outlined in the AKC CGC before moving on to other classes.

11:30AM - 1:00PM CGCU/ CGCA INSTRUCTOR: SHARON CULLMANN

This class teaches dog and handler teams the skills needed to pass the AKC CGCU and CGCA tests. This class will meet at the club and sometimes out in the community. Testing for these titles will be given at the end of the class. Prerequisite: Obedience Fundamentals and CGC skills passed.

MEMBER OBEDIENCE CLASSES THURSDAY MORNING! APRIL 23RD – JUNE 6TH, 2024

9:00AM - 10:00AM BEGINNING SCENT

INSTRUCTORS: NANCY YEOMAN/ MARY KENDALL

This class will give you the opportunity to begin the sport of scent detection. Dog and handler will become more confident and independent as they learn to work together as a team and search for an odor. Prerequisite: Obedience Fundamentals

9:00AM - 10:00AM INTERMEDIATE RALLY INSTRUCTORS: LESLIE WHITE/ DANA ANSPACH

This class teaches the dog and handler teams the AKC Rally Intermediate Signs and exercises. Two courses will be set up for the third through the sixth week of classes. This will give everyone adequate practice in working courses at the intermediate level. Prerequisite: ability to work Novice Rally Signs

10:30AM - 11:30AM ADVANCED/ EXCELLENT RALLY INSTRUCTORS: LESLIE WHITE/ BONITA HOWE

This class teaches the AKC Advanced Rally jump and Excellent level signs. All three rings will be used for this class. Those starting this class on leash will begin to work off leash when ready. Two complete courses will be set up each week with excellent signs set up in middle ring. Prerequisite: Intermediate Rally Class

11:30AM - 12:30PM ADVANCED/ EXCELLENT RALLY INSTRUCTORS: LESLIE WHITE/ BONITA HOWE

10:00AM - 11:00AM Sequencing to Show

This class is for those planning on showing, including our trial. Dogs must be proficient on all equipment or comfortable bypassing the obstacles. Open to all levels of dogs showing.

11:00AM - 12:00PM Beginner Sequencing

This class works on sequencing & gaining a better understanding of crosses. Focusing on basic handling techniques & working smoother as a team is key. It will also focus on improving dogs' comfort with obstacles. This is the next step after fundamentals & after fundamentals.

12:00PM - 1:00PM After Intro Instructor: Steve Wheeler

This class will continue teaching agility skills by building on what you learned in the Intro class.

1:00PM - 2:00PM Intro to Agility Instructor: Steve Wheeler

Prerequisite to this class dogs must have taken and passed the Sub Novice Class. This class will cover the Agility basics.

5:30PM - 6:00PM - Master Sequencing

This class will focus on techniques for those showing at the higher levels such as excellent & premier. We will focus on more advanced handling techniques to become a consistent & successful pair at the higher levels. Dogs must be proficient on all equipment.

6:00PM - 6:45PM - Intro to Agility/Beyond Intro Instructor: Kathy Dullaghan/Patrice Reider This class works on sequencing & gaining a better understanding of additional handling techniques. Focusing on basic handling techniques & working smoother as a team is key. We will spend some time in the beginning of each class to work on weaves and the end of contact behaviors.

6:45PM - 7:30PM - Beginning Sequencing & Handling Instructor: Kathy Dullaghan

This class works on sequencing & gaining a better understanding of additional handling techniques. Focusing on basic handling techniques & working smoother as a team is key. We will spend some time in the beginning of each class to work on weaves and the end of contact behaviors.

7:30PM - 8:30PM - Novice-Open Instructor: Kathy Dullaghan

This class will focus on techniques for those who are showing at the novice/open level. We will continue to focus on team building & gaining skills to become successful at the novice & open level. Dogs must be proficient on all equipment or comfortable bypassing the obstacles. We will spend some time in the beginning of each class to work on weaves and the end of contact behaviors. We will end the class by running a whole course or just working on specific handling techniques.

Notes for all classes:

Master, Novice/Open, and Beginners Sequencing will all need to bring crates, so you can walk the sequences. It is important for you to understand whereyou are going & keep your team successful. No training collars inside of class, as they are not allowed in the ring at a show and they are also a safety hazard. All classes are limited to 10 teams.

5:00PM - 6:00PM GRAD NOVICE/ OPEN OBEDIENCE INSTRUCTOR: SANDY HOFFMANN

This class will introduce skills on two levels of obedience. Dog and Handler teams will work on learning to shape to a dumbbell and will do recalls over broad and high jumps or they will be working on carrying dumbbells over the high jump and retrieving a dumbbell over a jump as well as on the flat. Skills from both UKC and AKC disciplines will be taught and practiced. Prerequisite: Ability to perform an off-leash heeling pattern, dogs MUST be comfortable working in the ring with other dogs.

6:00PM - 7:00PM CGCU/ CGCA INSTRUCTORS: JJ DAGGETT

This class teaches dog and handler teams the skills needed to pass the AKC CGCU and CGCA tests. This class will meet at the club and sometimes out in the community. Testing for these titles will be given at the end of the class. Prerequisite: Obedience Fundamentals and CGC skills passed.

6:00PM - 7:00PM NOVICE OBEDIENCE INSTRUCTOR: LESLIE WHITE

This class teaches dog and handler teams the UKC and AKC Novice and AKC Preferred Novice exercises. Off-leash heeling is introduced in this class as well as Honor Dog and the Stand for Exam. Prerequisite: Beginner Novice and a team that is ready to begin heeling off-leash

7:00PM - 8:00PM INTERMEDIATE SCENT INSTRUCTOR: NANCY WRIGHT

Dog and Handler teams will work together and learn new techniques to search for more and varied hides and new scents. Teams will become more confident and independent in their searches in this class. This class will be held outdoors. Prerequisite: Beginning Scent

7:00PM - 8:00PM AKC NOVICE RALLY INSTRUCTOR: LYNNE WAHLSTROHM

This class teaches dog and handler teams the Novice Rally signs. All teams will learn to move through Novice Rally courses. Prerequisite: Obedience Fundamentals
